
EMILY FISHER LANDAU CENTER FOR THE VISUAL ARTS

DIGITAL ART

In this form, the artist uses a tablet, stylus, and Photoshop to sketch an image. The artist begins with a rough sketch which—just as in traditional painting or drawing—is layered with color and shading to bring the image to life. Yuhong Ding '17 came to Cushing as a traditional artist. Yuhong set to learning this new artistic medium by studying anatomy and spending hours drawing objects and people from real life. As with traditional painting, digital art requires that the artist choose the right color and the right brush or tool. But, as Yuhong points out, there's no color mixing or waiting for your paint to dry!


SILVERSMITHING

EXPLORING ABSTRACT ART WITH WILL DAY '89

During spring break, three Cushing artists—Lizzie Bourdelais '17, Allison (Ally) Frechette '18, and Breton Lorway '17—traveled to Colorado to spend four days with abstract artist Will Day '89 at his studio in Boulder. Bob Johnson, Chair of Visual Arts, and Caitlin O'Brien, Director of Parent Relations, accompanied the girls on this unique journey. Under Will's guidance, the Cushing group, along with three students from a local public high school, got right to work exploring and experimenting with colors, textures, styles, and layers. At the conclusion of the trip, the artists' expressive and bold pieces were featured during a reception for local alumniand parents.

TRANSITIONS



As this academic year comes to a close, the Visual Arts Department will mark the transitions of two longtime members of the department and the community.

After twenty years at Cushing. Carolyn Johnson will retire in June. When the Emily Fisher Landau Center for the Visual Arts was constructed in 1998, she joined the staff to manage the Carter Gallery and provide additional support to the expanded arts program, enabling it to grow and flourish in its new space. An accomplished artist and creator of exquisite jewelry, Carolyn became a member of the faculty in 2013, while also continuing her administrative work. Whether teaching, helping students select the perfect materials for their project, providing counsel, or juggling details behind the scenes, her warm presence has radiated throughout the building and the program.

As an article last year celebrating Cushing's 150th anniversary noted, "...for many alumni, Cushing's art program has never been under the care of anyone other than Bob Johnson." Hired by then-headmaster Dr. Joseph Curry in 1973 to head the Visual Arts Department, Bob has built a world-renowned program and inspired generations of students over more than four decades. That rarest combination of master artist and master teacher, his stamp on Cushing's program is indelible. His planned transition toward his retirement in several years has allowed the hiring of his successor, David Bottini, who will join the faculty and begin his own work as department chair in July. Cushing is most fortunate that Bob will remain as a faculty member during these years of transition. He will divide his time between teaching and alumni outreach, deepening connections to the world-wide community of alumni artists who took shape under his tutelage, a tangible legacy of his commitment to his students and his leadership.

That the Johnsons have lent a sense of family to the Visual Arts program is not surprising. Earlier this year, they celebrated 48 years of marriage, and they are parents to two Penguins, Annika '91 and Elizabeth (Liz) '92, and grandparents to three future Penguins.

Carolyn, the thanks and warmest wishes of grateful students, alumni, parents, and colleagues go with you, and you will be missed. We salute and thank you, Bob, as you hand off the reins of leadership, and we welcome David Bottini to Cushing, to join the exceptionally talented students and outstanding colleagues who compose Cushing's dynamic Visual Arts program.
